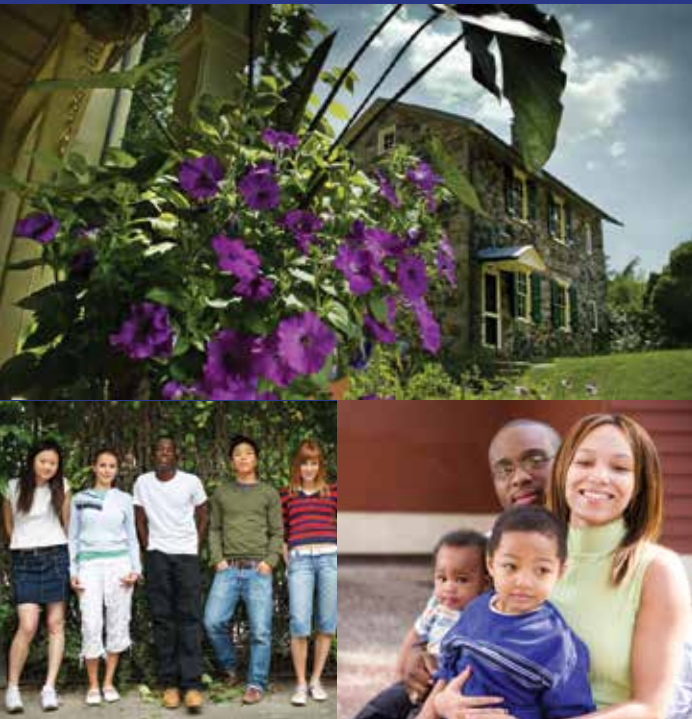


Delaware County Department of Human Services

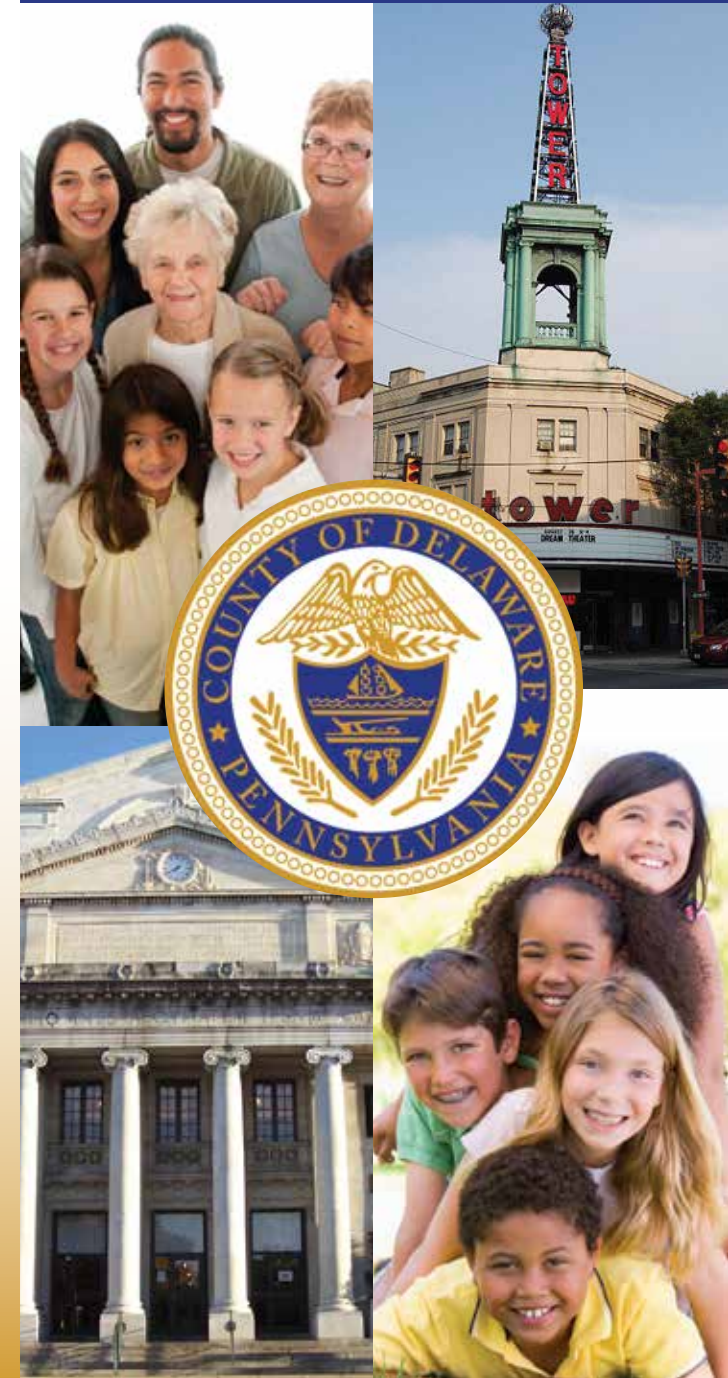

Child Care Information Services

The Delaware County Child Care Information Services (CCIS) provides child care subsidies to eligible families. The Federal and State funding for this program is provided through a contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services (PADHS). The CCIS serves children from birth to 13 years of age whose parents are employed and meet the eligibility guidelines set forth by the Commonwealth. Childcare is also available to a child who is 13 years or older but under 19 years of age who is incapable of caring for himself. Teen parents who are enrolled full-time in high school are encouraged to apply for childcare services. Parent/Caretakers who apply may be placed on a wait list based on the availability of funds. Fees are based on family size and income.

Children and Youth Services

Children and Youth Services (CYS) investigates all allegations of child abuse and neglect, as mandated by state law. In all cases, the mission of CYS is to provide for the immediate safety and protection of children, to keep children with their own families whenever possible, to provide temporary, substitute care for children when necessary and to reunite children with their families as quickly as possible after placement.

CYS provides a wide range of services to abused and neglected children from birth to age 18, and their families. CYS also provides services to adolescents who are at severe risk due to their behavior or that of their parent.

Office of Behavioral Health

The Adult Mental Health Division is an administrative office within the Office of Behavioral Health, which includes a 24 hour mobile crisis service.

The Child and Adolescent Division oversees a wide range of services and programs for children, adolescents, and their families in Delaware County.

The Division of Drug and Alcohol, also known as the Single County Authority (SCA) is an administrative office which oversees the delivery of treatment, prevention, and gambling services in Delaware County.

The Division of Adult and Family Services (DAFS) oversees a wide range of services to families and adults in Delaware County. DAFS is responsible for the oversight of the services that fall under the Continuum of Care for Homeless programs, including homeless prevention, emergency shelter and permanent housing. In addition, DAFS manages food assistance programs, medical assistance transportation and a variety of other supportive services.

Office of Early Intervention

The Office of Early Intervention provides evidence based supports & services to infants/toddlers & their families when children are experiencing a developmental delay or have a diagnosis that results in developmental delay. The supports & services are at no cost to eligible infants/toddlers & their families. The Office of Early Intervention is part of a statewide Early Intervention system under the direction of the state Bureau of Early Intervention, Office of Child Development and Early Learning.

Office of Intellectual Disabilities

The Delaware County Office of Intellectual (OID) is committed to independence and community involvement for people with intellectual disabilities, adults with Autism and children with developmental disabilities and their families. OID provides guidance, resource information and coordination, and monitoring. Services and supports are authorized according to priority of need, and may include: Family Support Services; in-home supports; adult day services; supported employment and other employment services; life skills training; and residential supports such as Lifesharing, community homes and supervised living arrangements. The principles of "Everyday Lives" are met through assisting each individual to use family and community resources, with specialized services as needed in the least restrictive setting.
